Antithrombotic therapy must be started within 2 days of acute stroke in patient who meet the screening criteria. One of the limiting factors in stroke care is the time of onset, which is a major influence on treatment choices and known success rates (recovery). Note that DVT prophylaxis therapy is considered inadequate for this purpose. STK-6

Five Stages of Post-Stroke Care. Stage 1. The Hospital / Acute Care Stage. A stroke

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is a medical emergency and those suffering a stroke should be taken to a hospital immediately. In fact, it's critical to get to the hospital within 3 hours of noticing stroke symptoms so that the clot-busting drug tPA can be administered if warranted. For this treatment to be considered, there must be enough time to determine, via a CT scan or an MRI, whether the stroke is ischemic (caused by a clot) or ...
