A natural sign cancels the effect of a flat or a sharp. Flats, sharps and naturals are called accidental signs. When they're placed before a note, they affect every note on the same line or space for an entire measure. A natural sign cancels the flat or sharp within the same measure.

Sharps, Flats and Natural Signs | Hello Music Theory

In music theory, a natural is an accidental which cancels previous accidentals and represents the unaltered pitch of a note. A note is natural when it is neither flat (\flat) nor sharp (\sharp) (nor double-flat nor double-sharp). Natural notes are the notes A, B, C, D, E, F, and G represented by the white keys on the keyboard of a piano or organ.

A Natural Sign A natural sign is another type of accidental that is used to cancel out any key that is sharped or flatted. It can cancel a flat or sharp from the same measure, or it can cancel it out from the key signature that is noted at the beginning of the sheet music.

Using naturals. The position of the natural: The natural sign can be placed in front of a note (it is an accidental) or next to the clef in the key signature, and in both cases it cancels the effects of all other accidentals. With letters, we write "C natural" or "C \natural " for short.

Although sign theories have a long history, Peirce's accounts are distinctive and innovative for their breadth and complexity, and for capturing the importance of interpretation to signification. For Peirce, developing a thoroughgoing theory of signs was a central philosophical and intellectual preoccupation.
